If you are divorced and remarried outside of the Catholic Church without a Decree of Nullity/Invalidity, or if you are a Catholic and are married outside of the Catholic Church, you may not partake of the Sacraments, including the reception of Holy Communion. Until it is shown otherwise through the ministry of the Tribunal, no person is free to enter into another marriage without the appearance or occasion of serious sin. However, a divorce alone does not affect or hinder in any way, your participation in the Sacraments. A divorced Catholic is free to receive the sacraments. However, if you are divorced and have remarried, or if you are divorced and in a new relationship, or if you are living with someone without a Decree of Nullity/Invalidity (and your former spouse is still living) you may not partake of the sacraments, including the reception of Holy Communion). Consider seeking a Decree of Nullity/Invalidity which will enable you to return to a full participation in the sacramental life of the Church. CATECHISM IN A YEAR

Why are there so many signs and symbols in the liturgies?

God knows that we men are not only spiritual but also bodily creatures: we need signs and symbols in order to perceive and describe spiritual or interior realities.

Whether it is red roses, a wedding ring, black clothing, graffiti, or AIDS armbands- we always express our interior realities through signs and are understood immediately. The incarnate Son of God gives us human signs in which he is living and active among us: bread and wine, the water of Baptism, the anointing with the Holy Spirit. Our response to God's sacred signs instituted by Christ consists in signs of reverence: genuflecting, standing while listening to the Gospel, bowing, folding our hands. And as though for a wedding we decorate the place of God's presence with the most beautiful things we have: flowers, candles and music. In any case, signs also require words to interpret them.

Why do the sacred signs of the liturgy need words too?

Celebrating the Liturgy means encountering God: allowing him to act, listening to him, responding to him. Such dialogues are always expressed in gestures and words.

Jesus spoke to men through signs and words. So it is in the Church, also when the priests offers the gifts and says, "This is my Body...this is my Blood..." Only these interpreting words of Jesus cause the signs to become sacraments: signs that bring about what they signify.

Proceed with caution

In a bygone era you might hear religion teachers tell their students that every sin we commit is another nail in Jesus' side. Although today we might phrase things differently, in truth, Christians believe that Jesus suffers for our sins, and our failures to act with love have consequences far beyond our human understanding for which we will be held accountable. That is why scripture tells us to stay alert, and Christian philosophers advise caution. As French philosopher Blaise Pascal says in *Pensées*: "In each action we must look beyond the action at our past, present, and future state, and at others whom it affects, and see the relations of all those things."

Once, as she was taking bread hidden under her cloak to feed the hungry, noblemen stopped her, demanding to know what she was hiding. But what they saw was not bread but roses!
