PRECEPTS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

1 You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor. We must "sanctify the day commemorating the resurrection of the Lord" (Sunday), as well as the principal feast days, known as Catholic holy days of obligation (catholic-holy-days-of-obligation). This requires attending Mass, "and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days."

2 You shall confess your sins at least once a year. We must prepare for the Eucharist by means of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). This sacrament "continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness."

3 You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season. This "guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy."

4 You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church. "The fourth precept ensures the times of asceticism and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart."

5 You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church. "The fifth precept means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability."

Note that these precepts of the Catholic Church are required, unless you have a legitimate reason for not meeting them. For example:

If you are sick, tending to a sick child, or camping in the wilderness on Sunday and cannot get to Mass, it is not a grave violation to miss Mass that day.

Children, the elderly, and pregnant or nursing women do not have to fast on normal fast days (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday).

Caso Roe contra Wade... Derecho a la Privacidad

En el caso Roe contra Wade, nuestra Suprema Corte sostuvo que las mujeres tienen el derecho constitucional a la privacidad, y esto incluye el aborto.

La palabra "aborto" no se encuentra en ningún lugar en la Constitución. También es interesante que la palabra "privacidad" está totalmente ausente. Aun así, la corte dijo que el derecho constitucional a la privacidad se encuentra "emanado de la penumbra" en la cláusula de libertad de la Constitución.

Esto sólo es palabrería y esta gimnasia verbal es un perfecto ejemplo de "activismo judicial" lo que en términos simples significa que la Suprema Corte comenzó con la conclusión política que deseaban y descaradamente torcieron la Constitución para meterla. En pocas palabras, la mayoría de los jueces que decidieron el caso tenían una agenda política y manipularon nuestra Constitución.

A pesar de la falta de justificación legal de la decisión del caso Roe contra Wade uno debe preguntarse el por qué cualquier derecho a la privacidad permita a una madre embarazada abortar a su bebé. De hecho, todos los derechos en la Constitución tienen límites y hay muchas cosas que ocurren en privado que la ley no permite. Antes de que la sociedad pueda decir que el derecho de alguien para participar en cierta actividad se deriva de su derecho a la privacidad, debe primero contestar la pregunta – "¿La privacidad para hacer qué? "

En el caso del aborto, la pregunta no es si una mujer tiene derecho a la privacidad, más bien si su derecho a la privacidad reemplaza el derecho a la vida de su bebé. Decir que si es afirmar que cada derecho expresado en la Constitución tiene límites, con la excepción de uno que no está expreso, pero que "emana de la penumbra".

El único punto de vista legítimo es que cuando la "elección" de un individuo costará la vida de otro ser humano, esa "elección" no puede ser considerada cuestión de privacidad.
